## **CSI** conference

The international reps attending the CSI conference are sharing travel information and ideas via Dropbox and Google Groups.

## ISC/SCI 2024 conference

The ISC/SCI 2024 conference (The Art of Connection) was virtual, with about 100 attendees. Sessions included software concerns, embedded indexing, working while traveling, and handling multi-authored works. There was a special networking event where new indexers could ask

experienced indexers in virtual chat rooms questions about indexing. There was also a cross-stitch pattern of a magpie that was shared with the attendees.

## Communication

There was discussion of how to best communicate changes in officers to the other societies. Some societies contact each other directly when there is a change in officers. Others rely on international representatives to pass on such information. ISC/SCI sends out a communication package when officers change to inform the other societies, as well as other groups, of any changes.

Spam is another issue for officers. Using generic email addresses, such as <a href="mailto:president@society.org">president@society.org</a>, is a factor in getting spam, but having generic addresses is helpful in terms of history and continuity of the office and its communications.
